


Objectives :-

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TOPIC : DO WE NEED A PARADIGM SHIFT IN THE CONCEPT OF DEVELOPMENT?

The programme started at 11:00 am. Raichel Eli Pathreesh, student of Semester 5, BA anchored the event. The welcome address was delivered by Anjun P, of semester 5, following which the Head of the Department, Ms. Tiji Peter gave the inaugural address. The respected Principal of the college, Dr. Suman Alexander was also present and she addressed the gathering wishing success to the new venture of the department. At 11:30, the resource person, Dr. Leni V, Associate Professor of Economics of our college began the lecture. He spoke on the topic: "Do we need a Paradigm Shift in the Concept of Development?" He argued for the need of reconceptualizing the idea of "development." Understanding it in merely economic terms, quantifying it using national and per capita incomes, leads to a skewed picture made of numbers rather than social realities.

The lecture began with an introduction to economic terminology and asking pointed questions thought-provoking questions to the audience regarding the meaning of terms like development, capital, income, etc. Citing examples from history and contemporary social phenomena, he emphasised the inappropriateness of a dated notion of development. While economic development is no less significant for the well being of a nation or society, classing a nation as developed or developing merely on the basis of income and/or expenditure to the neglect of social well-being is often the case. Holistic development requires more qualitative assessment methods.

Students of semesters four and five also attended the lecture. The banner (hand-made, out of organic materials) and the organisation was arranged by the students of semester five.





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TOPIC: CURRENT TRENDS IN EMBRYONIC STEM CELL RESEARCH

The second NOESIS lecture was delivered by Dr. Dr. Jean Jose, the IQAC coordinator and Assistant Professor of Zoology. The lecture began at 11:45 am. Using a Powerpoint presentation, he first explained the scientific terms used in the title, "Current Trends in Embryonic Stem Cell Research". The advances in this area of research and its merits and demerits were elaborated. The lecture concluded with a discussion on the ethics of doing research on human embryos as well as the revolutionary transformation of human lifestyles in the future.

There was a fifteen minute post-lecture discussion during which interesting questions were raised by the audience. The futuristic possibility of eradicating death (the attainment of immortality) due to old age or disease, was pondered in relation to a Stephen Leacock short story, "The Man in Asbestos." The problems in practical application of stem cell protection and research in this area in a country like India where the possibility of its misuse and exploitation looms large were touched upon. The lecture was highly informative and engaging.

The Google feedback survey conducted later showed a positive response from the side of the students. They judged the lecture as satisfactory and showed their interest in ^{attending} conducting more contemporary science-based lectures.
